

## Privacy Policy - Summer School AI + Data: Practice & Law

Pursuant to art. 13 of EU Regulation No. 2016/679 (GDPR), and in general in observance of the principle of transparency, we herewith provide you with information about the processing of your personal data.

This Privacy Policy is designed to inform you:

- How and why your personal data is being processed
- What personal data is being processed
- What your rights are in relation to the processing of your personal data
- How to contact us so you can exercise your rights.

### Data Controller

The Data Controller is: Fondazione Bruno Kessler, with a registered office in Trento, via Santa Croce, 77 (Italy). Pursuant to art. 37 of the Regulation, the Data Controller has designated a Data Protection Officer (DPO) who may be reached via the following channels: [privacy@fbk.eu](mailto:privacy@fbk.eu), +39.0461.314.370.

### Purposes

Your personal data is processed within the scope of the Summer School and for the following purposes:

- A. registration and participation to the summer school;
- B. processing and compliance with pre-contractual requirements;
- C. processing and compliance with contract related requirements;
- D. networking;
- E. mailing of institutional informative material;
- F. document the event for institutional, archiving and communication purposes including, but not limited to, the following categories and/or similar categories: presentations, reporting documents, creation of informative material, communication activities on institutional channels and/or through local, national and international press and through websites and social networks;
- G. contact future communication on the activities, projects and events of FBK & OECD.

The following data categories may be processed for the above mentioned purposes:

- Normal personal data, i.e. name, surname, e-mail address, work affiliation, professional role and work experience;
- Data revealing the person's image and voice, i.e. video, audio, photographic recordings (called also "recordings");
- Data concerning any allergy, illness, and/or dietary needs or restrictions.

In accordance with the data minimization principle, only the personal data that are deemed necessary for the objectives of the Summer School will be processed (see section "How will the data be processed").

### Legal basis

The legal basis for the processing of personal data during the initial application, via the google form, to the Summer School is consent (article 6, para 1, and the subsequent Eventbrite pagesub a, GDPR).

The legal basis for the further processing (i.e. once the applicant has been selected to participate in the Summer School) is the performance of the contract (article 6, para 1, sub b, GDPR) to which the data subject is party (participation at the event). The legitimacy to the processing of data derives from the fact that it is necessary for you to participate at the event organized by the Foundation and for us to fulfill the related contractual and legal obligations. Refusal to provide such information will make it impossible for you to participate at the event.

As regards the the processing of special categories of personal data for the participation to &

dissemination of the summer school (see “Purposes, sub A & F), the purpose of mailing of institutional informative material (see “Purposes”, sub E) and the contact future communication on the activities in the field of technology & compliance (see “Purposes, sub G), the legal basis for the processing is the explicit consent given by the person concerned during the registration. Given consent is optional, but refusal to give such consent will make it impossible for FBK to inform you about its institutional activities (i.e. newsletters) and/or to give you special attention during the catering service.

#### How will the data be processed?

FBK will aim to minimize the amount of personal data collected through the different activities. Your personal data shall be processed:

- manually and through manual and/or automated means;
- through online questionnaire (google form);
- by individuals authorized to perform such tasks;
- by using proper measures to ensure confidentiality and avoid access by non-authorized third parties;
- in contexts that do not compromise the personal dignity and the decorum of the Data Subjects, ensuring the necessary precautions to guarantee the confidentiality of the use.

We inform you that the public event may be recorded and disclosed on FBK and/or co-organizers’ institutional channels. If the interested party prefers to not be recorded or photographed he/she must inform the FBK staff beforehand.

The registration system to the events uses the online specialized system Eventbrite.com, which terms and conditions and privacy policy are available at: [www.eventbrite.com/privacypolicy](http://www.eventbrite.com/privacypolicy).

You can find all the technical and organizational measures adopted by FBK to ensure proportionality and necessity of processing and to prevent illegitimate access, unwanted modification, erasure, and explicit violations of personal data at the following link [bit.ly/MisureFBK](http://bit.ly/MisureFBK)

No automated decision-making process, nor any profiling activity is taking place.

#### Where will data be processed?

The activity of processing personal data takes place on the territory of the European Union. Should the activity include personal data processing outside the European Union, in the absence of an adequacy decision from the European Commission, we will undertake additional measures in order to guarantee a level of protection equivalent to the one offered in the European Union. We will respect the provisions set out by the applicable legislation on personal data transfer towards third countries (chapter V of the GDPR), such as Standard Contractual Clauses provided by the European Commission.

As FBK is using Google and Microsoft, and data transfer outside the European Union is not excluded, we will make sure that such a data transfer will take place within the limits and the conditions set forth in chapter V of the GDPR.

#### How long will the personal data be stored?

The personal data collected shall be deleted after the summer school activities took place, unless otherwise prescribed by contractual and/or legal obligations.

Video and photographic recordings shall be stored in order to document the institutional, archiving and communication related activities.

If applicants consented to being contacted for future events (see “Purposes”, sub G), their name, e (see “Purposes”, sub G)mail address and affiliation will be stored for a period of maximum 5 years after the closure of this Summer School.

#### Will the personal data be shared?

Without prejudice to communications required to fulfil legal and contractual obligations, all data collected and processed may be shared with:

- The co-organizer of the summer school, the OECD Trento Centre for Local Development;
- The registration systems: Google Form and Eventbrite;
- Other entrusted data processors for the marketing and dissemination of the summer school;
- Insurance company;
- Travel agencies, transport companies, printing companies;
- Hotels, tourist services and similar;
- Venue managers.

Personal data shall not be disseminated, besides for institutional and communication purposes indicated and for networking purposes indicated in the present privacy policy.

### Your rights

You have certain rights regarding your personal information. Read more about them below.

- Right to be informed – this information sheet is designed to inform you about the use of your personal data. You also have the right to know whether automatic decision-making (e.g. by an algorithm) is taking place.
- Right to Withdraw consent – if you have consented to the processing of your data, you may withdraw your consent at any time and after you have revoked your consent, your data shall no longer be processed. You can withdraw your consent, at any moment, by sending an email to [privacy@fbk.eu](mailto:privacy@fbk.eu).
- Right of Access – you have the right to have a copy of the information that is being processed and to make a Subject Access Request (via the contact details below).
- Right to Rectification – you have the right to have inaccurate personal data rectified. You may also be able to have incomplete personal data completed.
- Right to Restrict Processing – you have the right to request the restriction or suppression of your personal data. This means you can limit the way the project uses your personal data rather than having it erased.
- Right to Erasure – you have the right to have your personal data erased. However, the project will not retain personal data unless a valid legal basis for doing so exists.
- Right to Data Portability – you have the right to obtain and use your personal data for your own purposes, where the legal basis for processing is consent or the performance of a contract.
- Right to Object – you have the right to object to the processing of your personal data at any time.
